The figurative breath—God’s Word of

Life• Along with food and water, our flesh also needs air to breathe if we want to live. In the same way, our spirit needs the Word of God to live.

- *Then the Lord God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the **breath of life**; and man became a living being. (Gn 2:7)*
- In other words, God gave His living Word (breath) to beings of mere flesh (dust) and transformed them into living beings (living flesh + living spirit).

Living beings with the breath of the Almighty

- Originally, God created man in His own image and likeness, which is that of a living

spirit (Gn 1:27, Zec 12:1).

- God is His Word (Jn 1:1). Where that Word goes, God goes (Jn 1:2), especially because that Word creates the image of God (Jn 1:3) and is life for our spirits (Jn 1:4).
- Jesus was the Word made flesh, which is why Jesus said that the words he spoke were “spirit and life” (Jn 6:63).

**Spiritual death—being cut off from the
breath**

- Man made a covenant with God, promising not to disobey God's word or eat the fruit of good and evil,

which are Satan's words (Gn 2:17).

- By abandoning God's word for Satan's, which has no spiritual life, we were cut off from the breath of life.
- God was grieved when all our thoughts turned away from Him to evil and He was forced to leave, leading to both spiritual and physical death (Gn 6:5-6).
- This is why the wages of sin is death (Rom 6:23) and why the soul who sins is the soul who dies (Ez 18:4).

So this I say, and affirm together with the Lord, that you walk no longer just as the Gentiles also walk, in the futility of their

mind, being darkened in their understanding, excluded from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, because of the hardness of their heart; and they, having become callous, have given themselves over to sensuality for the practice of every kind of impurity with greediness.

grave—mere flesh• Without our living spirit, we

returned to the

dust or ground (Gn 3:19). Just like a dead person is buried in a grave, the body of someone with a dead spirit can be considered a grave or tomb.

- *Their throat is an open grave, with their tongues they keep deceiving, the poison of asps is under their lips;*
(Rom 3:13)
- *“Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which on the outside appear beautiful, but inside they are full of dead*

men's bones and all uncleanness.” (Mt 23:27)

Figurative resurrection

- Resurrection is going from death to life when the breath is restored.
- Depending on what kind of breath and what goes from death to life, resurrection can be physical (flesh) or spiritual (spirit). •

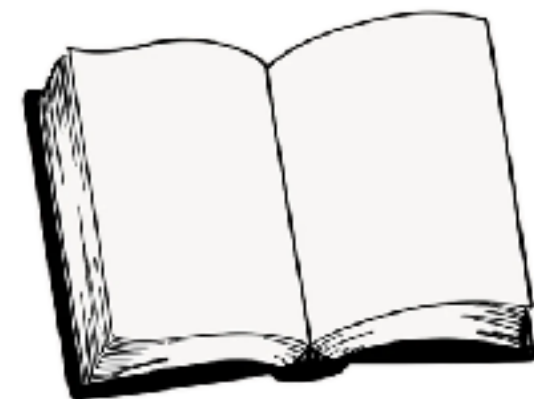

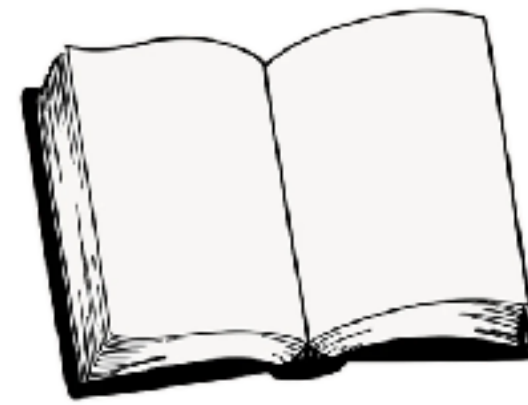

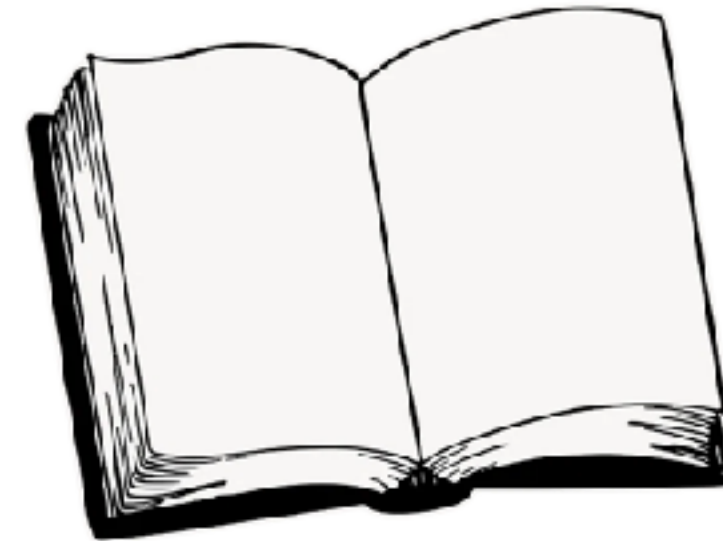
Summary and conclusion
